

## Personal Journey with Stef Gebbie

Last week I had the pleasure of talking with Stef Gebbie; a woman who has been horseback riding across Australia for the past seven months! Stef began at the mouth of the Snowy Mountains, Victoria and plans to finish her journey in Margaret River, Western Australia. Joining Stef are her two horses Mr Richard a seventeen-year-old Arab, and Micky her four-year-old Piebald. Stef takes turns riding her horses while the other carries her supplies. Growing up with horses, Stef has always had an adventurous spirit.

Ordinarily Stef works as a bushwalking tour guide in Tasmania in the warmer months and likes to spend her winters traveling. Always looking for an adventure Stef thought that this cross-country journey would be per-



fect for her. Originally Stef wanted to ride the Bicentennial National Trail which follows the edge of the eastern seaboard from Victoria to Queensland. However, with the current drought the trail is closed to the public. If Stef couldn't ride South to North, then she would ride East to West! Before she could set off though she needed to undergo an intense planning period. Stef's horses were her main concern when



researching for the trip. Learning about how to properly provide the nutrients needed for such a journey was at the forefront of her mind. By using a satellite map, Stef could plan her route according to prominent water and crop sources. Although this worked most of the time, Stef ran into some trouble when a water source turned out to be saltwater! Stef learned on the go how to read the land to avoid this problem again.

Stef tells me her two horses are loving this adventure! I don't think they have had this much exercise and chances to explore the countryside in their whole lives! As long as

they've got food and water, they are loving life. The same goes for Stef, although she probably wouldn't object to running hot water at her fingertips. Once a week Stef tries to go to a caravan park to have a shower, do some laundry and charge her phone. If the distance between towns is too long, like during her time across the Nullarbor, Stef will camp out in her swag.

Stef knew that riding across the Nullarbor was going to be her biggest challenge of the trip. Fortunately, a kind stranger who had been following her journey on Facebook, offered to drop off supplies while she was crossing this dry landscape. Stef has felt the love and support from so many people during her sevenmenth long journey. Just last week when Mr Richard fell ill and the threesome were unable to make it to Gnowangerup, Stef met local farmers Kathy and Ross who generously let her in their home for a much-needed break for her and her boys. Unfortunately, Mr Richard had to be floated to the vet in Albany and Stef set off for Margaret River with Micky. There they will be reunited with Mr Rich who is staying with a friend and is thankfully now in good health.



To get back home from Margaret River Stef will catch a truck ride East, hopefully in time for Christmas. She is very much looking forward to getting back to the comforts of home. Getting back to work and saving up for her next big adventure is also on her to do list. Stef hopes to one day ride across America!

Science Supports WA Farmers' Use of Glyphosate

Member for Roe, Peter Rundle MLA says a ban on the use of glyphosate will have a detrimental impact on farming across WA.

In Parliament Mr Rundle called on the State Government to stop raising concerns about the use of the herbicide and back the science on the safe use of glyphosate in the State's agricultural sector.

"Australia has one of the most robust chemical regulatory systems in the world," Mr Rundle said.

"The Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority is our national regulator and reports the chemical glyphosate is safe to use provided it is used per the label instructions.

"The banning of this widely used herbicide would mean a return to far more toxic chemicals and over-tilling of the soil.

"If environmentalists want to go down the path of calling for a ban, they really need to look at the facts which are supported by rigorous investigations into the science."

Mr Rundle said for farmers to produce enough food for global needs while storing carbon and soil nutrients in the process, they need to use the tools which are the safest and most efficient.

"Glyphosate is one of these tools and as the APVMA have stated categorically on a number of occasions, is safe to use as long as it is used according to the label," he said.

"No farmer would knowingly overuse or misuse a chemical or herbicide. As individuals, we want to protect our health, that of our family and that of the consumer.

"We have used Glyphosate for over 40 years. In that time our farming practices have improved so that we can minimise the application of chemicals. The technology of machinery and our own business practices ensures that we produce a commodity which is safe and of the highest quality in the world.

"I call on the WA Government to heed the science and assure farmers they will not have to fight another battle to preserve their evolved and safe farming practices."

# Water Supply in a Bushfire This information could save your life.

If you plan to stay and defend your home you must have an INDEPENDENT water supply and pumping capability. Scheme water may not be available due to damaged infrastructure and cuts to electricity. Experience shows that when there is extreme demand water supply and pressure are at risk.

Water Corporation makes preparation for the bushfire season to cope with extreme conditions. Despite these efforts, it is likely there will be a reduction in water pressure, and scheme water supply tanks may run dry in the event of fire.

Labor Stalls Again On Animal Activist Trespass Laws

Member for Roe Peter Rundle says the victims of illegal animal activism have been turned into the villains by the State Government's change of approach to stronger trespass legislation.

Mr Rundle has continued to question the Attorney General in Parliament about the status of the new laws that were promised in May.

"The Attorney General refuses to say when farmers can expect support from this government to protect their farms and families from the intrusions of the vegan protesters," Mr Rundle said.

"And now it is clear the Attorney General and Minister for Agriculture have taken the extraordinary step of attempting to amalgamate legislation to cover both the horse racing industry and the agricultural industry.

"This effectively makes those who are seeking the protection of stronger trespass laws potential targets of scrutiny from inspectors."

Mr Rundle said Minister MacTiernan's push for stronger inspection provisions for producers and processors means the very people asking for protection now face the real prospect of random searches on their property for no reason.

"While I support any Bill which will protect the welfare of retired racehorses, integrating this amendment into the trespass laws contradicts the very reason for the trespass laws," he said.

"The Minister for Racing has been able to devise a plan for racehorse welfare less than a month after he was shocked into action following the ABC knackery expose.

"The Attorney General has taken since May to even suggest there may be a Bill in the pipeline to protect farmers. He keeps coming up with excuses including the addition of the racehorse amendments to cover his lack of attention to this very important Bill.

"Between them, the Attorney General and the Minister for Agriculture have effectively turned the table on farmers and processors who could be under threat of scrutiny through no fault of their own."

Mr Rundle called on the Attorney General to finalise the animal activism trespass Bill and get it into Parliament as soon as he can for the sake of farmers and processors.

"If he fails to do so he will once again show them that this Government has no regard for their livelihoods," Mr Rundle said.

# Corteva and Nutrien Ag Solutions deliver early Christmas present to local clubs

Four rural sports clubs from Western Australia will receive an early Christmas present each of \$2,500 thanks to a promotional partnership between local sales reps from Corteva Agriscience and Nutrien Ag Solutions outlets.

"The Corteva grant was a fantastic opportunity for our community and our little team. Sporting equipment is very expensive and to get our team off the ground we received a lot of second-hand equipment from other cricket sides around the region.

"We're incredibly grateful for that support, but this money from Corteva will allow us to buy new sporting gear and safety equipment, and perhaps even a bowling machine to help with skill development."

Corteva Agriscience Territory Account Manager for the West, Linda Viviers, said the company is committed to working with the communities they serve.





Baby walkers – buy smart, use safely

Baby walkers are a common sight in family homes. But they can be a dangerous product with more than 100 children ending up in hospital emergency departments each year because of baby walker accidents.

Consumer research shows that 32 per cent of carers placed no restrictions on where a baby walker was used, which is really concerning. A baby walker allows a young child to travel a distance to an unsafe area, such as stairs.

Consumer Protection and Australia's product safety regulators are looking to educate parents and carers who are considering purchasing a baby walker, or giving one as a gift or hand-me-down. We want to raise awareness of the dangers and encourage safe use.

Babies in trip or fall accidents involving baby walkers commonly suffer head or facial injuries from hitting the ground. However, being able to manoeuvre around rooms and access normally out-ofbounds things in a baby walker, means little ones can be hospitalised due to burns from hot food or drinks or being hurt by sharp objects.

You may have used a baby walker with one child without incident but don't be lulled into a false sense of security.

Before purchasing or using a baby walker check for safety features. Baby walkers must have a mechanism to help reduce the chance of a child toppling down stairs and steps and they should also have a warning label.

Follow the manufacturer's instructions for assembly and use carefully by:

- supervising a child in a baby walker at all times;
- limiting the area a child in a baby walker can go in a home; and
- ensuring the floor where a baby walker is used is flat, even and cleared of objects.

## MEDIA RELEASE ALBANY AND ESPERANCE WA

TITLE: Bush foods create opportunities to talk about reconciliation and Aboriginal empowerment.

The potential healing effects of bushfood extended into discussions about reconciliation and Aboriginal empowerment at Merinj Kaartdijin, Australia's first Aboriginal Food Knowledge Forum in some years, held in Albany between 22 - 23 November. Over 100 attendees from across WA heard from national and internationally recognised experts speak about the common ground created by sharing bushfoods, as well as the complexities of managing traditional cultural knowledge, protecting intellectual property and growing local native plants.

The topics of discussion were put to the test through a bushfood field trip into the Albany hinterland with local Noongar experts from Kurrah Mia guiding the attendees. The trip included viewing oyster beds at the culturally significant Kalgan Fish Traps, complemented with catering prepared by local Noongar business, the Kinjarling Indigenous Corporation. This was followed by a foraging tour at Twin Creeks Conservation Reserve in the Porongurup Ranges, which culminated in a remarkable bush food inspired gourmet lunch hosted by the Friends of the Porongurup Range.

Lead organiser Dr Peter Twigg of South Coast NRM said "The forum brought together a fabulous range of local. interstate and international experts, specialists and producers to examine the opportunities and challenges emerging in the contemporary bush foods market. Through lively and wide-ranging presentations, which focussed on Aboriginal knowledge and cultural intellectual property, participants got a real sense of the potential convergence between local provenance bushfoods, agricultural innovation, ethical farming and discerning consumers that could deliver significant benefits to Aboriginal people".

A keynote address from indigenous advocate Joe Morrison positioned the forum in a national context. A poetic wrap-up by acclaimed local author Kim Scott challenged attendees to reflect on the best way forward in the emerging bushfood space to ensure that traditional knowledge, economic empowerment and agricultural innovation are strategically deployed in ways that maintain cultural integrity.

The Merini Kaartdijin forum coincided with the Kinjarling Diinda Ngardak celebration gala dinner on 23 November at the Albany Entertainment Centre. Opened by Aboriginal Affairs Minister and Treasurer Ben Wyatt the dinner concluded a week of celebrity chef-led intercultural cooking activities with Aboriginal high school students from across WA. Nearly 200 guests enjoyed an extraordinary bushfood dinner and marvelled at the achievements and the successes of the Aboriginal students and the unique educational catering program.

The forum was arranged by South Coast Natural Resource Management, through funding from the Australian Governments' National Landcare Program in partnership with Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development and Kinjarling Djinda Ngardak and supported by Katanning Landcare, Great Southern Development Commission, City of Albany, and the Albany Chamber of Commerce & Industry. ## Wayne Officer- Grass Tree Turnings

Wayne Officer is a self-taught high-quality wood carver based right here in Gnowangerup. Three and a half years ago Wayne started his own home hobby business called Grass Tree Turnings which focuses on creating feature pieces made from reclaimed timbers native to the Great Southern region. These hidden treasures were scavenged from friends and family, firewood cutters and farmers. You



know what they say, "Another man's trash is another man's treasure", which in Wayne's case he turns the trash **into** treasure. The idea of turning discarded native timbers into beautifully unique works of art is incredibly satisfying to Wayne. His work is meticulously hand crafted to showcase our native trees in an environmentally responsible manner.

I was fortunate enough to catch a glimpse of this lengthy process when visiting Wayne's workshop. From the many shelves of reclaimed timber to the finished products, this was a sight to behold. When asked where Wayne finds his inspiration, he replied from the timber itself. "Sometimes the timber will speak to me", he says, and working with the material rather than against it allows him to produce more creative and unique pieces. In the past Wayne has also been commissioned to create custom-made pieces designed by himself and the buyer. Wayne prides himself with the high quality of every piece that he creates. The use of French polish, he feels, really enhances the natural beauty of the timber.

As mentioned, Wayne uses only native timbers found in the Great Southern. He works mostly with grass

tree, which he makes all his bases out of, sheoak, jarrah and occasionally rare timbers such as the fir tree. Once Wayne was lucky enough to stumble upon rare swamp mahogany when he purchased some old house stumps for a dollar each! What he thought was Jarrah turned out to be swamp mahogany, which he tells me you cannot purchase commercially. Despite the rare timbers he has been able to find, Wayne's favourite timber to work with is sheoak.

One of the many tools that Wayne uses to carve these

timbers is the Lathe. At the

start of Wayne's adventures in wood carving he purchased a cheap lathe, which served its purpose for the most part. At this point wood carving was just a hobby and Wayne was deliberating on purchasing a new \$3000 lathe. His son wisely said to him, "It's your xbox dad", the lathe was something that made Wayne happy just like an xbox brings happiness to his son. This was enough



encouragement for Wayne to justify the expense.

This home hobby business stemmed from Wayne's love of working with timber. Due to a workplace injury Wayne is unable to work in physically demanding fields. However, with more than twenty years of furniture building and ceramic tiling experience under his belt, it is clear to see that Wayne prefers to be hands on when it comes to his job. Wood carving started out as the perfect hobby to occupy Wayne's free time, as it satisfied the physical and creative aspects of his previous jobs without straining him. He can decide for himself when he works and manages his pain with short bursts of activity throughout the day.

Wayne has a stall at the Kalamunda Artisan Markets in Perth, where his wares can be viewed. Wayne realizes that due to his high quality and the limited market in the Great Southern, he would have to find his target audience in the people of Perth. He is also in talks with a major hotel chain with the interest of a permanent display in one of their hotels in Perth CBD. He can continue to create unusual works of art because of this! Wayne believes that if you have a dream you should pursue it no matter what anyone says. It's all about trial and error and finding out what works for you and what doesn't. A strong sense of his own style is what has pushed him to keep going even after a well-known Albany Artist had some suggestions. They commented that Wayne was "wasting his time" carving by hand when he could be digitally designing wood carvings. This only fuelled Wayne's passion for the unique and pushed him to prove this artist wrong. Since then many people have expressed their love for his collection because they know every piece is lovingly handcrafted and believe it's what makes Grass Tree Turnings so special.



We also had a best dressed winner in Lorraine and best dressed gentleman in John, husband and wife coincidently, aren't they just beautiful!



Home building approvals – have a say

Did you know that currently when you build a home in Western Australia, such as a one or two storey house, there are no mandatory inspections during, or at the end of, construction?

In a recent social media survey run on Consumer Protection's Facebook page, 55% of respondents wrongly thought local government WAS required to carry out inspections of home building work during construction of single residential dwellings.

Under WA's current home building approvals processes, a building surveyor must verify that proposed construction complies with the minimum prescribed building standards, prior to work commencing. However, there are no mandatory inspection requirements for single residential buildings – a local government permit authority CAN inspect the building work at any stage of construction but there is no obligation to do so.

There was a recent case where a new build home in metropolitan Perth had to be demolished and rebuilt due to a faulty, cracked concrete slab. Consumer Protection's view is that mandatory inspections could prevent this sort of issue by potentially identifying the problem at slab pour stage.

So, should inspections of home building work be compulsory during construction? That's one of the things a public consultation by Building and Energy (formerly the Building Commission) is asking. The consultation, which can be accessed via <a href="https://www.dmirs.wa.gov.au">www.dmirs.wa.gov.au</a>, launched in September and closes on 9 December 2019. The paper presents three options for consideration:

- business as usual:
- the introduction of full private certification; and
- improvements to the current process in line with report recommendations.

Building and Energy particularly wants to hear views on the potential costs and benefits of the various options. For example, how much might consumers be prepared to pay during a home build for mandatory inspections? Would an extra couple of thousand dollars be worth it for peace of mind and to prevent a higher spend fixing problems further down the track? Also, should any mandatory inspections, if they are introduced, be done by private industry inspectors or by local government?

Whether you're a property owner, in the building industry or local government, a future home builder or you have an interest in home construction, your feedback is welcome.

Building and Energy is part of the same State Government department as Consumer Protection – the Department of Mines, Industry Regulation and Safety – and they can be contacted on 1300 489 099 during business hours if you would like to know more about the consultation.


