



Free mammograms for GNOWANGERUP women

If you are a woman aged 40 or over you can access the FREE screening mammography service in Gnowangerup. BreastScreen WA's mobile service will be located at Gnowangerup District Hospital, Yougenup Road from 16/08/2016 to 18/08/2016.

Breast cancer is the most common life threatening cancer for women and one in eight women in Australia will develop breast cancer in their lifetime.

Having a screening mammogram (breast x-ray) every two years significantly increases the chance of a woman surviving breast cancer and reduces the amount of treatment required. More than 75% of breast cancers occur in women over the age of 50. Research shows that screening is most effective for this age group.

BreastScreen WA's Medical Director Dr Elizabeth Wylie, said screening mammography was the most effective method for early detection of breast cancer.

"Screening every two years is vitally important to increase the chance of a breast cancer being detected when it is too small to feel or be noticed. Finding a cancer at this early stage often means that the breast cancer is small and more treatable".

"A free screening mammogram is one of the best things that women can do to look after their health. Breast screening saves lives and only takes 20 minutes," said Dr Wylie.

Screening mammograms may detect up to 90% of breast cancers.

Any woman with a persistent change in a breast should see her doctor immediately.

The mobile service will then be moving to Lake Grace and Dumbleyung.

BreastScreen WA encourages women to make an informed decision about having a mammogram. For more information please visit the BreastScreen WA website www.breastscreen.health.wa.gov.au

The aim of our program is to achieve an overall participation rate of 70% of women aged 50-69 years. The participation rate is calculated as the proportion of eligible women in the target age group screened at least once over a 24-month period.

Gnowangerup is part of the Statistical Local Area (SLA) of Gnowangerup. The estimated female resident population* of this SLA for the target age group is 164. In the last 24 months 62% of the total target population (50-69 year olds) in this SLA have attended screening.

One month until Australia's largest online event

In just one month's time, millions of people across Australia will pause to complete the 17th national Census of Population and Housing, in what could be the country's largest and most significant online event.

The 2016 Census will employ more than 39,000 temporary staff who will travel a distance equivalent to almost 200 trips around the circumference of the planet in order to count over 24-million people in about 10-million households, who come from over 200 countries and speak over 300 different languages.

Head of the 2016 Census, Duncan Young, said the August 9 Census will be the easiest and most accessible ever, with people able to complete their Census from their own home on their smartphone, tablet or computer. We expect 16 million people to complete the survey online.

"Later this month and into early August, the ABS will deliver some 10 million letters to every household around the country in preparation for Census night," Mr Young said.

"These letters will be addressed 'To the Resident' and include a unique login and instructions on how to complete the Census online, as well as details on how to request a paper Census form."

While a majority of Australians won't hear from the ABS for a few weeks to come, Census Remote Area Mobile Team Leader, Steven Pearce, has driven 4,500km across northern Australia in the last two weeks, to ensure everyone in his remote area is counted as part of the Census.

"Within the 160,000 square kilometre area which I'm helping to count, I estimate there'd be less than 3,000 people living here, but that does not mean the data is less important," Mr Pearce said.

"My primary task now is to make contact with the communities and all the relevant stakeholders in those communities and lay a bit of groundwork which will enable us to carry out the Census in as efficient manner as possible."

Mr Young said the ABS' 105 Remote Area Mobile teams highlight the ABS' extensive efforts to ensure everyone in Australia completes a Census form wherever they are on Census night.

The national Census has been a part of Australia since just after Federation and provides the most comprehensive and accurate picture of our rapidly growing and changing population.

Despite 16 previous Censuses over 105 years, the 2016 Census will coincide with the Olympics for the first time ever this year. Mr Young hopes that while Australians are waiting for the swimming finals to start on August 9 they will do their bit for the country by completing their Census.

"The 2016 Census is Australia's moment to pause and make a difference, and help shape the future of Australia's investment in housing, roads, schools and hospitals." Mr Young said.

Background information on the 2016 Census of Population and Housing

Data collected from the 2016 Census will support funding decisions for services and infrastructure including housing, transport, education, industry, hospitals, and the environment.

Data from the 2011 Census revealed that Australians come from more than 200 countries, speak more than 300 languages, belong to more than 100 religious groups and work more than 1,000 occupations.





SHIRE PRESIDENTS REPORT

June completes the financial year for the Shire and with it the completion of the works programme. Congratulations to staff and the works crew for completion of the programme with the exception of the Gleeson Road gravel re-sheet. While the re-sheet could have been completed in this year as materials were all sourced and stock piled, weather conditions would have compromised the quality of work so the decision has been made to wait for improved conditions. Inclement weather has impacted on gravel road conditions highlighting any deficiencies in structure or formation.

As raised at the Road Forum held in Borden we appreciate feedback and documentation via the (work request/complaints forms) to assist the Works Manager manage a well-structured maintenance programme across the Shire. Road closures will continue to be monitored throughout the winter and feedback and support will assist safety for road users and maintaining road integrity.

Weather conditions in the first half of June impacted on WANDRRA funded contract repairs as contract crews were stood down when weather conditions were detrimental to attaining quality standard repairs. In the second half conditions improved slightly allowing crews to continue. There are a number of factors that are taken into consideration when deciding where the contract crews are working such as; the road hierarchy, extent of the damage and the availability of gravel in a particular area. The crews have been working on Old Ongerup Road and Coromup Road due to the extent of the damage and the immediately availability of gravel.

The Council agenda for June continued the process for a possible exciting private land development providing blocks from 4000m to 6.5ha with submissions received and acknowledged.

Other Shire business included a meet and greet with the Great Southern Development Commission on Friday the 24th. GSDC highlighted their development role and royalty for regions funding opportunities. Feedback was sought from the community members present who provided very positive perceptions on shire activity and growth. Business members also raised their concerns for attracting new staff without the availability of adequate affordable housing.

A national conference for young people in agriculture, Scarborough Beach, Sunday session, ten pin bowling, Ausplow factory tour, new friendships and networking groups, what more could you want from a North Stirlings Pallinup Natural Resources Young Farmer Tour?

On the way we collected 18 keen participants— ten in Borden, four in Gnowangerup, one in Katanning and met another three in Perth. On our arrival in Scarborough after a few dodgy bus games we enjoyed a 'getting to know you' Sunday session at Matisse Beach Club, ready for the beginning of Innovation Generation on Monday morning. Innovation Generation is an annual conference aimed at 18-35 year old agricultural professionals, held in a different venue around Australia every year. Traditionally hosted by GrainGrowers, this year it was co-hosted by the former WA Young-Farmers group, AgConnectWA.

The conference received around 160 registrations from all over

Australia, so we had a lot to learn and lots of new faces and networking opportunities. Landmark WA road safety campaign launched

Member for Wagin Terry Waldron MLA has shown his support for last week's launch of the first two of five major road safety education campaigns.

Mr Waldron said the important new campaigns were launched in an "effort to change the behaviour of motorists who put West Australians' lives at risk".

The first two campaigns target the very best and worst drivers and are based on some of the most extensive road safety research ever conducted in Australia.

"The Zero Hero campaign recognises the 800,000 WA motorists who haven't lost a demerit point in the last three years and seeks to 'normalise' that good driving," Mr Waldron explained.

"Through these 'Zero Heroes', the State Government aims to highlight the vast majority of drivers who are doing the right thing and to encourage them to positively influence the driving of those around them, including their children, parents, friends and other loved ones," Mr Waldron said.

The second of the launched campaigns targets the 'Risk Takers' - those who speed, drink drive, use their mobile phones and do not wear seatbelts. Data shows that in 2013, 62 'Risk Takers' were killed on WA roads.

Nationals WA candidate for Roe Peter Rundle said research showed that 'Risk Takers' seemed to endorse speeding and didn't see any of these behaviours as road safety issues.

"They just aren't motivated by possible personal injury," Mr Rundle said.

"Though research indicates that they are motivated by the threat of losing their licence, subsequent loss of freedom and negative social consequences, and this second campaign reflects that."

The 'Risk Takers' campaign documents the life of 'Nate', who has lost his licence and is forced to rely on his mother to drive him around. The campaign follows Nate over the period he has lost his licence, as the stark reality of his new life sets in.

Mr Waldron said: "This campaign aims to have those risk takers think about how their life would be negatively impacted should they end up in a similar position," Mr Waldron said.

Research shows that risk takers find this situation much more realistic, than actually dying as a result of their risky driving.

Funding of \$4 million has been allocated from the Road Trauma Trust Account to deliver the road safety education campaigns in 2016-17.

The campaigns will be shown across television, radio and online and through outdoor advertising.

Waldron encourages local governments to apply for youth scholarships

Member for Wagin Terry Waldron MLA is encouraging country local governments to apply for funding through the *Royalties for Regions* Country Local Government Fund (CLGF) Youth Development Program.

Mr Waldron said country local governments were now able to apply for funding through the program, which will see the creation of 20 traineeships providing young people with career prospects in their local communities.

The traineeships are part of a \$1.2 million investment into young people in regional Western Australia, aimed at creating entry-level jobs.

“It is really important that we continue to create job opportunities and invest in the future of our young people in the regions,” Mr Waldron said.

“Local government is a respected and sought after sector in regional WA and careers in the industry are providing rewarding opportunities for young people across the State.”

Nationals WA candidate for Roe, Peter Rundle, said the youth program was an excellent platform for engaging regional young people, particularly by encouraging them to consider a future in local government.

“Starting a career in local government could offer local young people the chance to make positive differences in their communities and provide them with financial security and in turn job longevity,” Mr Rundle said.

Mr Waldron said while supported by *Royalties for Regions*, this “fantastic initiative” enabled participants to not only gain useful work skills but also encouraged them to stay in the regions through the provision of job options.

“Not only will this initiative enable participants to gain valuable skills through experience, it will enable them to stay in their community of choice.”

Regional Development Minister Terry Redman said the CLGF was helping regional local governments build their capacity and identify opportunities for development.

“The Country Local Government Fund contributes towards building and maintaining a positive lifestyle for our regional communities and is an important investment for *Royalties for Regions*,” Mr Redman said.

The CLGF Youth Development Program is one of five initiatives that has received \$5 million in funding, over two years, to improve the capacity of country local government. Under the initiative, country local governments may access up to \$5000 towards course fees per trainee and a \$15,000 wage subsidy. It also includes 40 scholarships of up to \$10,000 each for young country local government employees to undertake training and 16 two-day workshops on leadership and career development.


