2019 is the year that Cranbrook Districts Motorcycle Club writes the history books moving from a "grass roots" club to a state level club, with a State Motocross junior and senior round two weeks following the annual South West Interclub Series. These two events are set to be great spectator viewing and will not disappoint with over 130 riders expected each day.

Track works have been underway preparing for the state round with the pedestrian bridge and camping ablution build constructions on schedule. Other

completed works are cementing the bike wash down area, secondary pit return lane for sponsor vehicles and start gates modified.

Sukey Hill has caught the motocross fraternity by surprise with many state level riders having not made the journey yet down from Perth to Cranbrook to check out the event prior. It is expected that many riders will use the South West Interclub as a practice for the state round.

South West Interclub on Sunday 23rd June showcases motocross action from Bunbury, Manjimup, Collie and Southern Capes (Busselton) Motorcycle Clubs. It is a jam packed day with classes for juniors to novice, clubman, ladies and veterans.

Double header WAMX State Round is on weekend 6-7th July with Juniors Saturday followed by seniors on Sunday. It has been awhile between drinks for state level motocross events in the Great Southern. 1982 was the last one hosted by Albany MCC at Miniup Park on Robinson Road, in which an 18 year old Jeff Leisk, (a famous international WA motocross rider) competed on a Yamaha bike. Local riders Paul Smithson (Kendenup) and Corben Wienert (Albany) are very excited to have an event in their backyard.

Full canteen menu, free spectator entry, new spectator bridge and close motocross action! Mark 23rd June and 6th-7th July in your diary to head up to Sukey Hill.

Walpole's only bank withdraws from CRC

The only bank operating out of Walpole has announced it will close next month.

Walpole Bendigo Bank, run by the local Community Resource Centre, will close on June 28 after its head office in Mt Barker decided it was too costly to maintain the service.

Walpole CRC general manager Cherie Smith said she had to let go

three staff members because of the closure.

"The time and cost factor for the Mt Barker branch to service its agency in Walpole are very costly," she said.

"All up, it's a three-hour journey for them to service the agency here. It costs a lot of money to buy and sell cash because you need security guards and armoured trucks," she said.

Ms Smith said many Walpole locals were over 60 and frequently used the town's bank.

"There's an awful lot of our population who don't use computers or internet banking," she said.

"They would be the one who are going to really feel this."

Ms Smith said unless there was a miracle in the next month, there would be no bank operating from Walpole.

"We want to explore every possible avenue and we're still in the process of talking with banks from Denmark and Albany to see if they are willing to help us and open a branch here," she said.

Walpole CRC is holding internet banking classes to help its community deal with the prospect of not having a local bank.

"As you can imagine, there are an awful lot of community groups here in town and they often deposit money here in the bank," Ms Smith said.

"I would say we've got around 100 businesses and families using the bank regularly.

"Unless they have a card for the organisation, then they wouldn't be able to do it in the post office.

"They have to go to the bank in Denmark. Change is also a big issue — local businesses would have to get their change from Denmark banks, too."

Gnowangerup wins bid to become home to the world's largest replica Tractor



Earlier this year Gnowangerup bid against many other towns in WA to become home to the world's largest replica tractor. Last week, Trachmach formally informed Gnowangerup Shire CEO Mrs Shelley Pike, and the group who put the successful bid to Trachmach made up of Tim Beeck, Rod Richardson, Dick Garnett, Kirsty Bucahanan and Kate O'Keeffe that they had won out all other contenders to be the town that would house the Trachmach Giant Tractor – the world's biggest replica Chamberlain tractor.

Trachmach was established in 1981 by Bob Lukins. The mission of Trachmach is to preserve the agricultural and industrial heritage of Western Australia. Trachmach has grown and now has branches throughout Western Australia, consisting of over 500 members, young and old. Trachmach President John Piavanini advertised the opportunity to all towns to be home of the world's largest Chamberlain Tractor through Farm Weekly, with the brief being that the tractor must be made as authentically as possible to replicate the original Chamberlain tractor which drove out of the factory in Welshpool in May 1949. The plan is for the tractor to be five times the size of a normal 40K Chamberlain, which will make it larger than Wagin's Big Ram standing 50 feet high!

The Committee hopes to build the tractor locally and are working with the Shire on the potential sites to permanently house the tractor. The arrival of the tractor in Gnowangerup offers the town and Shire enormous tourism opportunities. It will place Gnowangerup on Australia's 'List of Big Things' alongside other icons such as the Big Apple in Queensland, The Big Banana in Coffs Harbour and The Big Croc in the Northern Territory. There are currently over 60 'Big Things' listed on Australia's register, and we are excited to add one more to the list in Gnowangerup!

Drivers urged to pay attention on roads

One in six drivers who died in a crash in the Great Southern last year was killed due to inattention.



Road Safety Commission figures have revealed inattention was linked to almost 17 per cent of the 18 fatal crashes in the region as Statewide statistics exposed an even more concerning trend.

Last year's total of 29 inattention-related crashes represented a 70 per cent increase over the preceding five-year average of 17.

Great Southern police district Superintendent Ian Clarke said inattention could range from illegal mobile phone use to simply adjusting the radio or speaking with passengers.

"You may take your eyes off the road and put your wheels in the gravel and roll the car over, but if you're not wearing a seatbelt that's what makes it a fatal crash or a serious crash," he said.

"More often than not there is more than one contributing factor to a crash, even though inattention may have created the situation to start with.

"When you are driving a car or truck or whatever it is, your sole concentration needs to be on that act; it can't be doing anything else."

In the Great Southern in 2017, inattention was recognised as the cause of three of the 15 fatal crashes.

So far this year, nine people have already lost their lives on Great Southern roads.

Supt Clarke said illegal mobile phone use remained a big issue, while motorists not buckling their seatbelts had resulted in a number of fatal crashes in the region.

"It leads to a real sense of frustration with the emergency responders that are going to these crashes, and to them it's a senseless waste of life," he said.

"It's those sorts of things that are really impacting on the emergency responders because they can see by a simple action that person has lost their life."

Supt Clarke said a safe trip could go horribly wrong very quickly unless families established basic ground rules to avoid inattention.

"It's really important that we do have those conversations with our partners and our children and even our parents because that's the sort of stuff that will potentially save lives; just people being aware and having it at the forefront of their minds when they are driving," he said.

"I'm not suggesting people need to be frightened about going out driving, what I'm saying is that it's a good idea to talk about that, and if you're having those conversations early, particularly with your children, One would hope that is going to progress into their driving habits when they get older."

Junior Hockey Carnival—Bunbury

This year's hockey carnival once again delivered. Nearly 30 years on, Bunbury - with its 14 grass



fields and two turf areas - hosts arguably the biggest carnival in the Southern Hemisphere, over the WA Day long weekend.

In 2019, 138 teams (almost 1800 players) took part in 470 games, across 12 divisions, over three days. Teams came from as far as Esperance to attend. The South West Smarter Than Smoking Junior Championships allows age groups 5/6, 7/8, and 9/10 to enter championship divisions as well as carnival divisions. Ongerup Hockey Association entered 5 teams this year over different divisions with

players from Borden, Ongerup and Gnowangerup representing. With lots of kids at boarding school coming back and representing Ongerup Hockey Association with others playing for the Lower Great Southern Hockey Association.

The Ongerup boys 7/8 division did an amazing job, winning their competition!

Players from Gnowangerup District High School also represented the Central Great Southern Hockey Association and played fantastically, placing 4th/10 in their pool. Well done kids! See you next year.






