Award to Karen Dye




Karen was a representative at the Inter League Pairs and Fours and gained selection in the Inter Zones events and also played in the Country Side against Metro prior to Country Week.

Council business for the month of April included 3 financial commercial items. Council has received and approve tenders for the storm damaged road infrastructure and drainage reinstatement, the successful tenders were:

- RFQ1 (Roads Tender) was awarded to Gaia Civil
- RFQ 2 (Drainage Tender) was awarded to Mining Drilling Services

The Shire has resolved to negotiate with Landcorp for a parcel of land on the new development on Quinn Street. The site provides group dwelling opportunities which will match shire accommodation requirements and will lead to a review of all shire housing stock.

The last confidential item was the lease of Virginia land. One Expression of Interest was received and the lease was awarded to the Gnowangerup Sporting Complex as it met the commercial financial requirement set by Council.

The Road Forum held in Borden was well attended and it was a great opportunity for Council to present current funding scenarios, the road hierarchy and associated levels of service and cost implications. Feedback on operational issues was presented which was a useful follow up to the customer satisfaction survey conducted earlier in the year. A summary of the meeting has been compiled to go on the shire web site and individual responses to community members have been sent out.

Our community has had an extremely challenging few weeks in experiencing a couple of fatal tragedies that saw all the community pulling together to provide support and comfort to those effected. A big thank you to all supporting agencies both professional and our volunteers our thoughts are with you during this difficult time. Our community has shown its strength and resilience and Council would like to send its condolences and sympathy to all the families and friends affected by the tragedies.

My Council Website

On 29 April 2016, the Hon. Tony Simpson MLA, Minister for Local Government; Community Services, Seniors and Volunteering; Youth, launched the State Government's *MyCouncil* website: www.mycouncil.wa.gov.au

The website presents the last four years of audited data provided by local governments in their Annual Reports and Compliance Audit Returns. This information was already publicly available and has long been open for scrutiny on local government websites.

It is important, however, that the information provided on the *MyCouncil* website is seen in its proper context, especially around interpreting simplified measures such as percentage rate increases, and financial health indicator (FHI) scores.

These measures are only indicative of the overall performance of a local government. Because one local government receives a higher or lower FHI rating on the *MyCouncil* website, does not necessarily mean that it is performing better or worse financially than another local government. Inviting direct comparisons based on simplified measures can often be misleading.

To properly understand the financial picture of a local government a member of the public needs to look at the broader picture and consider the many complex factors that contribute to it, including the range and level of services provided to the community, the efficiency of service delivery, and community satisfaction with their local government.

Local government officers are constantly working to improve their local government's performance and to produce positive outcomes for their communities.



2016 NAIDOC Week Theme Announced

Songlines –The Living Narrative of Our Nation..

Songlines are the oldest living narrative of our nation, and will be the focus for the 2016 NAIDOC Week celebrations. NAIDOC Week 2016 will run from 3-10 July and is an opportunity for all Australians to come together to celebrate the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait people.

The 2016 theme, *Songlines - The living narrative of our nation* -will highlight the importance of Songlines to the existence of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

For Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, the Dreamtime describes a time when the earth, people and animals were created by our ancestral spiritual beings. They created the rivers, lakes, plants, land formations and living creatures. Dreaming tracks are sometimes called 'Songlines' which record the travels of these ancestral spirits who 'sung' the land into life. The National NAIDOC Committee encourages all Australians to explore and celebrate how, through Songlines, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people remain connected to Country and have been able to maintain and share sacred stories and ceremonies for tens of thousands of years.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people used Songlines to navigate vast distances and map oceans, waterholes, rivers, birds, animals, plants and hunting grounds. The paths of Songlines are recorded in traditional arts, crafts, dance, songs and stories and Mr Mitchell said he is excited to see how the theme will be reflected in the artwork submitted as part the National NAIDOC Poster Competition next year.


"Songlines crisscross the Australian landscape and extend for large distances across many of the beautiful land elements we have in this Country. It will be great to see how artists interpret the theme and Australia's landscape onto canvas", Mr Mitchell said.



Early sampling has shown lower nitrogen levels, probably due to good crops in the past few years.

The recent summer rains may mineralise some nitrogen.


- Sampling wet soils is a challenge. If you can't get a decent sample then don't persist - wait until the soil dries out.
- If soils are damp, sample early in the week and post ASAP. The lab will dry the sample on arrival.
- Make sure samples are sealed well. Moisture may make the box undeliverable - the samples may not arrive at the lab.






Shortlisted for the Man Booker Prize 2015**

GNOWANGERUP HOTEL DOUBLES CHAMPIONSHIPS




Severe weather warning dampened the motocross rider participation at the last Cranbrook Districts Motorcycle Club Day on Saturday 21st May, with only 21 riders racing. With a delayed start digging channels to drain the Rockwell Flats track and the day being cut short with the flaggies and riders bitterly cold and wet, it seems that yes motocross is definitely a winter sport!

For those of you who would like to become more involved with Cranbrook motocross then flagging and spectating Motorcycling WA our affiliated body is offering officials training courses in Cranbrook in June or July this year. Officials are the backbone of all motocross clubs and without them the day could not function. There are four main officials at each competitive event being, Steward, Clerk of Course, Race Secretary and Bike Scrutineers all positions require Motorcycling WA training every four years or proof of participation in that role.

The Race Secretary is the person responsible for the organization and pre event and post event management of a race meeting. The Race Secretary is responsible for affiliation, permits and licencing and checks that the motocross rider has filled out the entry and indemnity form correctly and has a valid licence. This is all done prior to racing so plenty of time to watch the day's events!

Scrutineer/Machine Examiner is the person responsible to ensure that every competing motorbike conforms to the regulations stipulated by Motorcycling WA and the event. The scrutineer also inspects all helmets and riding apparel to ensure compliance. This is also all done prior to racing so plenty of time to watch the day's events also!

Clerk of Course is the person responsible for the actual running of a race meeting. He or she ensures that the meeting is conducted in accordance with the Motorcycling WA policies and is responsible for all issues of safety. The Clerk of Course conducts the riders brief (meeting) prior to the commencement of the day.

The Steward is the "Top Dog" on the race day. All officials are answerable to him/her and their primary job is to handle disputes.






