

- · Gatherings limit raised from 2 to 10 people.
- Some additional non-contact public activities permitted.
- Soft start to Term 2 for public schools introduced.
- · Home opens permitted in accordance with the limit on gatherings.
- Weddings and funerals. up to 10 people.
- Outdoor personal training (no shared equipment) up to 10 people.
- · Gatherings limit raised from 10 to 20 people
- Public schools open
- · People encouraged to return to work, unless unwell or vulnerable
- Weddings and funerals, up to 20 people inside or 30 outside.
- · Some regional travel restrictions
- Cafes and restaurants permitted to reopen with restrictions
- Places of worship, libraries & community facilities; indoor outdoor fitness and dance classes may reopen, with a 20 patron limit and 4sqm rule

Public gatherings

- Non-work indoor and outdoor gatherings increased to 100 people.
- Indoor and/or outdoor venues with multiple, divided spaces may have up to 300 people, with up to 100 people in each space.
- Weddings and funerals can have 100 people inside or 300 people outside (cannot have 100 inside and additional people outside).

Cafés, restaurants, pubs and bars

- Alcohol can be served without a meal but patrons must be seated.

Food courts can reopen. Cinemas, arcades and museums

- Galleries, museums, arcades and snooker/pool centres can reopen.
- Cinemas, theatres and concert venues can reopen. but patrons must be seated.

Sport and recreation

- People can train and play full contact sport, indoor and outdoor.
- Gyms, health clubs and other fitness studios can reopen, with no restrictions on equipment. Gyms must be staffed at all times and undertake regular cleaning.

Beauty and personal care services

· Nail, tanning and waxing salons, spa, saunas, bath houses and wellness centres can reopen. When providing beauty therapy and personal care services there must be a distance of at least 1.5 metres between each set of client and staff.

Community facilities

· Playgrounds, outdoor gym equipment, skate parks and play centres can reopen

Attractions

- · Rottnest Island to reopen to the WA general public.
- Zoos and wildlife parks can reopen.



To Fellow Shareholders

I am writing on behalf of Gnp360 directors to update you on the IGA building project. We have been working very hard behind the scenes – drawing up plans, getting costings, working on fit out plans and prices. We have been working with Metcash (IGA's overarching body) and have been advised that we have to follow their model in order to trade under the IGA banner with a new build. The cost of doing this is significant (and quite exorbitant) but this is their guidelines and standard. So, we have also looked into refurbishing the existing IGA building which sits under a different set of criteria with Metcash.

We have come to the decision that a refurb/refit of the existing building, which our Cooperative now owns, is a much better use of shareholders money as there is significant (hundreds of thousands) difference between the two options.

As directors we feel our obligation is to our shareholders and how best to use your money and at the same time achieve a great outcome for the community.

We have engaged Advance Visual to help us in this project of refurbishing the existing building and we believe we can get the desired outcome by the end of 2020 (depending upon COVID-19). Attached to this letter is Advance Visual's response to our initial brief and some concept images of what could be achieved. Please keep in mind that the artwork used is a CONCEPT only, not the actual images.

CHANGES TO REFUSE SITE PROCESS IN GNOWANGERUP, BORDEN AND ONGERUP

You may be aware and have noticed some works happening at the Gnowangerup, Borden and Ongerup refuse sites. This is part of the Regional and Strategic Waste Management Project funding.

The refuse sites have now all been fenced off and will have a brand new gate system that requires a swipe card for entry. This is to prolong the useful life of the Shire refuse sites beyond 20 years as has been identified through our asset management strategy.

Each property owner will receive a form in the mail in the coming weeks. You will be required to complete this form and bring it to the Shire Administration Office to receive your card. Residents who are not property owners can attend the office to complete the form and receive their card. There is no cost for each initial card but if it is lost, there will be a replacement fee.

Please also be advised that the opening times for the Gnowangerup, Borden and Ongerup refuse sites will be set as below. This allows the Shire to complete maintenance when they are closed.

Hot safety tips for cold weather

Winter has officially arrived and many of us have already dragged out the winter woollies, electric blankets and hot water bottles, but it's important to make sure we are using these items safely.

Electric blankets, hot water bottles, heat (or wheat) packs and children's sleepwear are just some of the winter items that can pose an injury risk if they are old, worn or not used properly.

As with any product – but particularly products that can cause scalds, burns or fires – consumers should always follow user guides.

Each year more than 200 people in Australia are treated for serious burns caused by hot water bottles.

Before using them, you should always check for signs of wear and tear, including cracks forming.

Only use hot tap water, never boiling water, and replace the item as soon as it starts to look worn.

Should you use wheat bags or other heat packs, check that they come with clear heating instructions attached to the product and allow them cool completely before reheating.

If you notice a burning smell, it's probably been over-heated, so allow the wheat bag to cool down completely before disposing of it.

Many people assume when children's clothing or nightwear is marked 'low fire danger' it is not flammable, but this is not necessarily the case.

'Low fire danger' ratings take a number of things into account, including how loose or closely fitted an item is, and therefore the risk of it coming in contact with heaters or fire places.

You should always keep children away from open sources of heat to prevent what can be devastating burn injuries.

Always check electric blankets for signs of wear and tear before use, turn them off before getting into bed, and seek advice from your health practitioner before using one if you are pregnant or have diabetes.

Fake tractors sow financial grief

Everyone loves a bargain, but don't be fooled by deals on new tractors that look too good to be true.

Fake websites currently offering farm machinery at greatly discounted prices are swindling farmers right across Western Australia, with losses tripling in just one month to a whopping \$143,000.

So far we know of nine victims who have been scammed this way, after they ordered and paid for farm machinery from various bogus websites. Fake courier companies are also being used to fool consumers into thinking their purchases are on their way.

Unfortunately it's becoming increasingly difficult to distinguish a real website from a fake one, as scammers often steal the identity and ABNs of legitimate online retailers. They might also provide the same contact details, machinery photos and physical address of the legitimate business, so it looks like you're dealing with a proper business.

These fraudsters even know to follow the agricultural seasons to market machinery that may be needed at different times of the year.

As fast as these websites get shut-down, others are springing up in their place – so it's up to everyone to do their research before parting with their hard-earned money.

Everyone who shops online should only deal with well-known and reputable traders and get recommendations from colleagues, family and friends. An on-line search for warnings or reviews might also help indicate if the website is a scam.

Watch-out for payments requested via direct bank transfer, as it's much harder to get your money back. Scammers often don't allow you to use safer payment measures such as credit cards, where a chargeback can be completed for goods that fail to arrive.


