## March in your patch

**Occasional winter frosts (pretty much the rest of Australia, most of the inland, some areas of Victoria, most of SA and the southern area of WA)**

- It is still a little warm in this part of the world, but there are a heap of things you could pop in to the patch this March. Why not try cabbage, Asian greens, lettuce, rocket, tatsoi, silverbeet, spring onions, spinach, carrots,
- It's time to get happy with herbs, so try some parsley, basil, coriander (try a slow bolting variety if it's still pretty warm), rosemary, marjoram and thyme. You could give mint and lemon balm a go as well, but be careful to contain them as they can take over!
- Why not try some lovely flowering stuff in your patch as well, like: cornflower, calendula, dianthus, pansies, viola, snapdragons, stock, nasturtium, verbena and marigolds. These guys are great at attracting pollinators and beneficial insects to your patch, and I reckon they look tops as well.
- Consider a green manure crop to add some life and love to an overworked patch. At this time of year try faba bean, field pea, oats and wheat. This will improve your soil incredibly, and, for a bit of forward planning, you'll find it well worth the effort!
- Top up mulch on your veggie patches, herb gardens and ornamental beds, especially important for weed suppression at this time of year. A hot tip is to mulch after watering the patch, to a depth of about 7cm. Keep mulch clear of plant

stems....especially young seedlings. Choose a low environmental impact mulch, one that will enrich your soil as it breaks down.

- Plants feel the need for a feed at this time of year. A seaweed tea or low environmental impact liquid fertiliser is perfect, especially for the seedlings shoved in this month. Apply to the soil early in the morning, and in the concentrations mentioned on the packet.
- Weeding is an awesome job to do at this time of year. Cut down the competition between your tasty treats and these space invaders, and tidy up your patch. It may sound tedious, but it's incredibly rewarding!
- Water smarter at this time of year. Water first thing in the morning, and instead of quickie irrigation, a nice, deep drink a couple of times a week is far more beneficial!
- Of course, this is just a rough guide, and many of you will find your situation varies from the above listing, due to microclimates created in your garden, location in relation to your nearest major city, extremes of weather (Mother Nature does like to keep us on our toes) and garden type. But the one thing that remains the same for all zones and regions is this: start out the year as you mean to go on, and give your patch some much needed love! So, grab a cool beverage, slip, slop slap, and spend some time under your favourite tree, admiring your patch!

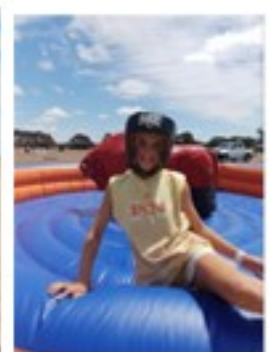

### NO PLAN FOR ROE IN LABOR'S REGIONAL JOBS TARGET

Member for Roe Peter Rundle has questioned the veracity of Mark McGowan's jobs plan, saying there was no detail on how more employment would be created in Roe.

Responding to the Premier's announcement of a promise to create 30,000 new jobs in regional WA over the next five years, Mr Rundle said a sure-fire way to kick-start the local economy would be for Labor to end its pillaging of Royalties for Regions.

"You can't grow regional jobs without investment. Gutting Royalties for Regions is the first jobs killer," Mr Rundle said.

Mr Rundle said cuts to aged care infrastructure projects, education assistants, airport extensions and innovative water projects meant job opportunities in Roe were drying up.

"Roe has seen no benefits, no outcomes and certainly no investment to provide new jobs or any expansion of the required services and facilities for more people to live and work in our community," Mr Rundle said.

In Parliament last week Mr Rundle directly asked the Premier what industries he expects to support job growth in the Roe electorate, and if he had a plan for regional investment to support his touted regional job creation.

"As usual, the Premier failed to answer the question, and spoke about the past, not the future," Mr Rundle said.

"It's clear the McGowan Government do not have a real plan to support regional communities and create new jobs."

The Nationals WA Leader Mia Davies said the Government had lost the faith of regional Western Australians and the rehashed jobs plan was meaningless.

"Labor promised at the 2017 election to create 50,000 jobs. Two years on, they are nowhere near meeting that target," Ms Davies said.

"This is the same Labor Government that promised to retain Royalties for Regions and continue to invest in regional Western Australia.

"Instead, they have pulled workers out of regional WA through centralisation of services and departments, tried to cut Community Resource Centre funding, killed off Royalties for Regions and cut education and health funding to the bush."

### Green light for Great Southern housing project

The Great Southern Housing Initiative has been given the green light to provide urgent quality housing for the region.

Assistant Minister for Regional Development Sussan Ley and Federal Member for O'Connor Rick Wilson met with Great Southern local government representatives in Gnowangerup on Thursday to discuss details of the project.

The Federal Government committed \$10 million under Round 1 of Building Better Regions Funding, however the project has been on hold after the WA Labor Government pulled \$11.5 million already set aside under the previous Liberal Government through Royalties for Regions.

Minister Ley said the project scope has since been reduced to construct 52 units, instead of the proposed 79, after the WA Government reduced its funding commitment to \$2.6 million.

The total project cost is now about \$22 million, with the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup sourcing additional contributors to help offset the reduced WA Government contribution.

"The Great Southern Housing Initiative has been designed to tackle a housing shortage in the region and keep senior residents and key workers living within their regional local communities and support local business," Minister Ley said.

"It will include 52 units for regional employees and independent living units across the shires of Broomehill-Tambellup, Cranbrook, Gnowangerup, Jerramungup, Katanning, Kent and Kojonup."

Mr Wilson said he was thrilled the project was able to proceed after a long, hard-fought campaign.

"Unfortunately the project almost didn't happen due to the WA Labor Government pulling their contribution," Mr Wilson said.

"I was able to get an assurance from the Federal Government to hold our contribution while the shire's sought alternative funding.

"Quality housing is important in attracting skilled people to small towns, particularly when regional shires are looking to hire employees for workforce gaps that can't be filled locally, either in the public or private sector.

"The lack of financial return on building new properties limits the incentive for investment and has created a shortage in suitable accommodation.

"I'm really pleased that we're able to help these shires fill the gap, because ultimately the ability to retain employees in these areas will support the local economy and ensure the delivery of key services is not hampered by workforce shortages.

"The provision of more seniors' accommodation is much-needed in the Great Southern. It will reduce the need for seniors to leave their communities at a later stage in life, which either fragments families, or else causes them to relocate to be close to ageing family members."

The project is expected to be completed by 31 December 2019.

### For the first time in 100 years, students Gnowangerup District High School have green grass to play on

*Children at Gnowangerup District High School will no longer have scrapes on their knees after the community banded together and installed green turf for them to play on.*

The Gnowangerup Community Water Harvesting and Town Greening Project was born in 2016 and took two years to come to fruition.

The project became a partnership between the school's Parents and Citizens group and the Gnowangerup Community Church and led by Cassy Beeck, who had watched her own children play on the school's dirt oval.

"The aim of the project is to provide water that can sustain more greenery in our town," she said.

In the early stages of the project, Ms Beeck dedicated herself to researching and writing grant applications and enlisted the services of a hydrologist to examine the water systems in the town.

They discovered a dam nearby that was underused and that became the main storage point for the new system.

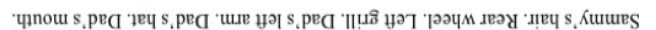
