Opening of the Gnowangerup Heritage Trail

Gnowangerup Heritage Trail

The Gnowangerup Heritage Trail has been a volunteer driven community project that has been over 15 years in the making. The Gnowangerup Heritage Trail is a 2km self-guided walk that takes walkers around Gnowangerup town site to explore the rich local history of the town. The trail consists of 8 storyboard signs and 12 bronze plaques that provide information to walkers about each site on the trail. Trail Walkers can pick up a Heritage Trail brochure in hard copy from the Gnowangerup CRC or access the interactive Heritage Trail map by scanning the QR code on each storyboard sign; which takes walkers to the Shire website which gives them access to even more interesting information about the trail sites, as they walk the trail.



On Friday 20th October 2017, the Trail was officially opened to the delight of the crowd of almost 30 people from across the district, who gathered outside the Gnowangerup Town Hall. The Gnowangerup District High School Choir opened proceedings with a rendition of “Grandmother’s Feather Bed”. The Shire President, Keith House thanked staff, contributors and the dedicated volunteers who had worked tirelessly to bring the project to completion. In particular, acknowledgement was made for the work of Koa Jaensch Project Manager, and project volunteers Helen Harris, Michael Lance and Glen Oliver as well as the other members of the Heritage Trail Steering Group, Robbie Minter, Jill Lesk and Yvette Wheatcroft and Shelley Hmeljak. The President also thanked Andrew Collins and Catherine Layton from ABC Radio Great Southern for their contribution to the project in the form of oral histories, which are featured on the Heritage Trail Website.

Attendees at the Opening were given a guided tour of the trail by Michael Lance and Glen Oliver who told tales of times gone by. The official opening function finished up back at the Gnowangerup CRC where refreshments, specially prepared by the Gnowangerup District High School, were served to guests. The Shire would like to thank the Gnowangerup CRC for partnering to deliver the Opening Ceremony, Lotterywest for the funding provided for the Trail, Gnowangerup District High School for the choirs’ performance and for preparing afternoon tea, the volunteers for their hard work and the community for supporting this important project, that many visitors and locals will enjoy for years to come.







Stay smart online

Email, the internet, social media and mobile apps are all common ways for scammers to contact potential victims so consumers need to remain alert to potential scams.

During Stay Smart Online week in October, the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) released figures showing its national Scamwatch site had received more than 51,000 reports in 2017 about scammers trying to con people online. Those online scam losses totalled nearly \$37 million, with people aged 45 to 54 most likely to lose money.

However, consumers need to stay vigilant about any deals that seem too good to be true, whether online or elsewhere. We recently alerted householders to glossy travel brochures with fake scratchies that were arriving in mailboxes, with at least one of the two cards enclosed declaring a \$US190,000 win.

The Get It On Holiday travel brochure and scratchie cards scam has been designed to gain personal information from the supposed 'winners' who would then be asked to pay fees upfront before receiving their non-existent 'prize'.

The top five scams reported to WA ScamNet from 1 Jan to 30 June 2017 were:

- Technology phishing, where consumers were contacted predominantly via email by someone claiming to be from a legitimate business seeking payment, or to gain personal information. Phishing also included consumers being contacted via a pop-up on their computers stating that their device had a virus, and to get rid of the virus the victim must give remote access and pay for the 'clean up'.
- Buying and selling online, including consumers purchasing products on fake websites.
- Relationship scams, often via dating websites, apps or social media with people pretending to be prospective companions. They play on emotional triggers to get money, gifts or personal details.
- Investment scams, such as consumers signing up for investment opportunities where they were later unable to withdraw their invested amounts.
- Fake invoicing, with consumers receiving fake bills (usually via email) and then paying them as they believed it had come from a legitimate entity.

So how can we avoid the scammers? Keep personal information secure online by changing passwords often, don't give credit card details to websites that aren't secure and do not send copies of passports or driver's licences to third parties that you did not contact yourself. Do not send money via bank transfer to someone you do not know, instead pay via credit card or PayPal where possible, as there is a chance of money recovery.

If you have given out personal information, then contact ID Care at www.idcare.org, a not-for-profit organisation that helps victims who have fallen victim to identity theft. If you have sent information about your bank accounts, then contact your bank immediately. They can change passwords and close the accounts if necessary.

Lastly, never respond to out of the blue friendship requests online from strangers.

BACKYARD READY

SPRING GARDEN CHECKLIST:

Here are 10 top tips for ways to direct your spring gardening urges to get the most from your garden.

1. Feed

Gardeners love to nurture their gardens. Early spring is the best time of the year to give everything in the garden a good dose of fertiliser. After the next fall of rain, scatter slow-release or pelletised fertiliser over your garden. As it breaks down and filters into the soil, it is absorbed by growing roots and used to fuel growth and flowering.

2. Lawn update

Apply a slow-release complete lawn food to all grass areas. Use a metal rake to remove any build up of thatch (dead growth giving lawns a spongy feel underfoot). If the lawn is looking sparse, reseed or returf bare areas. Before replanting, dig in organic matter and water over the area with a soil wetting agent. Keep everyone off areas that are being renovated until the new grass is growing vigorously.

3. Plant vegetables

Early spring is a rewarding time to plant vegetables, whether you're starting a new garden or popping some herbs in a sunny window box. Vegies and herbs to plant now (or after the last frosts in frost-prone areas) include summer salad vegies such as tomato, snow peas, capsicum or chilli, lettuce, cucumber, basil, rocket and parsley.

4. Quick colour

Flowering spring annuals can be planted now to give your garden a quick lift. Add instant colour with pots of cineraria, pansy, polyanthus or flowering bulbs such as daffodils and tulips. Also plan ahead for flowers later in the year. Buy punnets of late spring and summer flowers including petunia, phlox and impatiens (a good choice for shade). Seedlings can be planted in garden beds or popped into large pots for strategic bursts of colour.

5. Plant just about anything

Early spring is a rewarding time to plant trees, shrubs and annuals. Remove plants that have died or are past their best, or extend your garden to accommodate new plantings. Prepare for new plantings by clearing grass and weeds, then digging organic matter into the soil. When working out where to place a new plant take into account the amount of space that's needed as it grows both across and up (see plant labels for information on plant size).



6. Clean and mend

Warmer weather means more time spent outside eating, relaxing and entertaining. Check outdoor furniture and outdoor sitting areas in preparation for convivial times ahead. Wooden furniture may need to be repainted or re-oiled. Nuts and bolts should be checked and tightened. Canvas chairs may need to be cleaned or re-covered. Also, clean the barbecue and replenish gas bottles. Paving and other hard surfaces benefit from a vigorous sweep to remove accumulated leaves and dirt. Mossy or slippery paths can be cleaned and treated with a once-a-year product.

7. Repot

All container-grown plants, including indoor plants, which have been in the same pot for several years, or that have outgrown their current pot, can be re-potted now. Place plants into slightly larger pots with fresh potting mix or trim roots and replant into the old pot but with fresh potting mix. If you only have a few pots, buy a bag or two of potting mix. If you have a large number of pots, buy a load of premium potting mix from a landscape supplier to save time and money.

8. Prune

Plants that have already bloomed or have frost damage can be pruned to encourage new growth. Also remove old canes from perennials and grasses to make way for fresh spring growth. To keep shrubs, perennials and annuals in bloom over the months ahead, remove spent flowers.

9. Top up mulch

A quick way to spruce up the garden, cut weeds and save water at the same time is with a load of organic mulch. Remove weeds and encroaching grass from under trees and throughout garden beds and then spread mulch over exposed soil to a depth of about 5cm thick (for more advice on how to mulch, see 'What to do this week').

10. Water features

Top up water features and clean out ponds by removing accumulated leaves and rubbish that's blown in over winter. Remove dead stalks from pond plants and scoop out

RECIPE

Apple and cinnamon breakfast muffins



Ingredients

- 2 cups plain flour,
- sifted 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 cup bran 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 cup caster sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 1/4 cups buttermilk
- 2 tablespoons margarine spread, melted
- 2 large unpeeled apples, grated
- 1/2 cup raisins

Method

1. Preheat oven to 180°C (160°C fan-forced).

Line a 6 x 3/4-cup capacity muffin pan with large paper cases.

2. Sift the flour and baking powder together into a bowl. Stir in the bran, cinnamon and 1/4 cup caster sugar. Make a well in the centre. Whisk eggs, buttermilk and spread together then pour into the well. Stir gently until almost combined. Fold through the grated apple and raisins.

3. Spoon mixture into paper cases. Bake for 20 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Stand in the pan for 5 minutes before lifting onto a wire rack. Serve warm.

Tip: These muffin's can be made ahead and frozen for up to 2 weeks. Allow to thaw then warm to 160°C (140°C fan-forced) oven for 5 minutes before serving.






