Purple Bench Project – Gnowangerup Unveiling

The Shire of Gnowangerup in partnership with the Women's Council for Domestic and Family Violence Services (WA) and Anglicare WA would like to thank those who attended the unveiling of our Purple Bench.

Family and domestic violence affects people of all ages and backgrounds. Statistics show that one in three women have experienced physical violence since the age of 15 and that it is also the leading cause of homelessness for women and children in Australia.

The Purple Bench is part of an international initiative that began in Nova Scotia, Canada, which acknowledges the memory of women murdered by their partners. The colour was chosen in line with the global domestic violence awareness movement.

The commemorative Purple Bench here at the Shire Administration Building will act as a strong reminder that domestic and family violence has a huge impact on the community. It will also provide contact numbers for help and support agencies that residents can access should they ever need assistance with domestic or family violence related matters.

The Shire of Gnowangerup would like to thank Anglicare WA and the community of Katanning for donating funds towards this project.

This purple bench acts as a stark reminder that as a community we can make a difference, both with little and large steps.

The Women's Council is campaigning to have other local governments, refuges and domestic violence services across WA participate in placing benches to honour local victims and act as a visual reminder of the prevalence of domestic and family violence and its consequences within our communities.

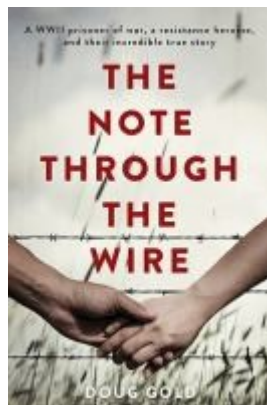
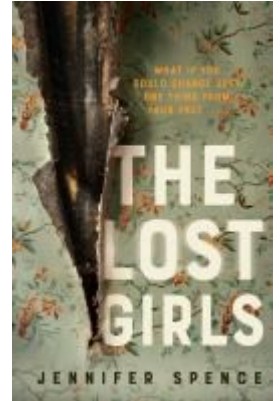

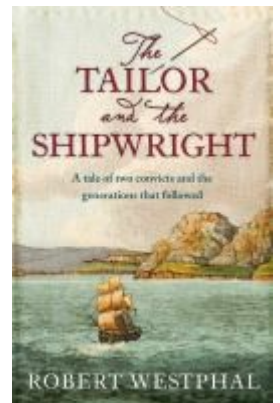
OCTOBER LIBRARY NEWS

A haunting tale of love and loss that will make you think twice ... 'It's not so hard to sacrifice your own life for someone else ... A much greater sacrifice is to do wrong for the one you love' What would you do if you had the chance to change a pivotal moment from your past? How far would you go to save someone you loved? These are just two of the fateful choices a woman must face in this highly original and hauntingly evocative detective story of love and loss. At the core of the enigmatic Stella's story, past and present, is a mystery she is compelled to solve, a beautiful young woman who went missing twenty years ago - and a tragedy much closer to home she must try to prevent. The Note Through the Wire is a true World War II love story about a Slovenian partisan, Josefine Lobnik, and a New Zealand prisoner of war, Bruce Murray, who met by chance when she pushed a note through the barbed wire fence of a POW camp. Gnowangerup student, Lincoln Patterson, was part of the WA College of Agriculture - Narrogin's triumphant fencing team at this year's Dowerin GWN7 Machinery Field Day.

It was Lincoln's first time competing in the challenger that saw the college's team take out the top honour in the Waratah Fencing Challenge against teams from rival agriculture colleges. It is the fourth time WA College of Agriculture has taken the title since the competition began in 2008.

Buying foreign money

Did you know you'll pay more when buying foreign cash at the airport than at any other location? Also debit or credit cards are usually the cheapest option for buying things overseas.

Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) research, to help us with foreign money purchase decisions, found:

Consumers who bought USD200 in foreign cash in February could have saved AUD40 if they bought from the cheapest supplier at a non-airport location. And the big four banks are consistently more expensive, especially for common currencies such as Great British Pounds (GBP) or United State Dollars (USD).

A customer who used a debit or credit card from one of the big four banks with no international transaction fees could save AUD13 on a USD200 purchase, compared to using a travel money card. With international transaction fees it would be a saving of AUD5.

A holder of a travel money card from one of the big four banks withdrawing the equivalent of AUD100 in GBP from an overseas ATM in May 2019, who had not pre-loaded GBP onto the travel money card, would be charged AUD8.90 (almost 9 per cent of the transaction amount) in ATM and currency conversion fees.

Shop around for foreign money before you travel – loyalty to your usual supplier (big four banks) or a last minute purchase at the airport is going to cost more. Remember buying currency online in advance is an option.

Compare the total price including the exchange rate and fees. Just because a service is advertised as 'fee free' doesn't mean it's the cheapest option.

Think about best payment methods when travelling overseas – what's accepted, certainty of price / total cost, convenience and what if it's lost or stolen?

Beware travel money card fees as well as costs incurred for loading Australian dollars but paying in, or drawing out, another currency.

With credit or debit cards consider any interest charges and annual fees. Again selecting to pay in Australian dollars can be more expensive than choosing the local currency.

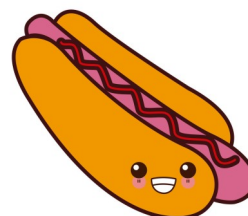

Dno's "Walk for Hope"

On the 9th of September Gnowangerup hosted a very special guest who is spreading an important message across Australia. I had a chat with Dno Summers whose goal is to walk from Bunbury to Sydney in aid of suicide prevention and mental health. Dno started the "Walk for Hope" on the 23rd of August after 4 months of preparation. Although Dno's aim is to ultimately end up in Sydney, the journey is just as important as the destination. By the end of his journey (whatever that may look like) he hopes to have encouraged at least one person to seek help or to support a mate going through a tough time. Dno's "Walk for Hope" is essentially a conversation starter.



Since our chat in Gnowangerup Dno has travelled from Bunbury to Esperance in 5 Weeks. That's over 600km! With him Dno has his trusty trolley, appropriately named "Hope", that carries everything he needs from town to town. He can fit his tent, water, food, cooker, clothes and anything else he might need along the way. Dno's goal is to complete the journey from Bunbury to Sydney in 4 months, but ultimately there is no time limit and is consciously making the decision not to pressure himself. Since this is such an enormous task, Dno has been focusing on small goals to achieve. Making it to the next town in x amount of time is an example of how he sets himself achievable goals to keep himself motivated and not get overwhelmed.

On his way to Gnowangerup Dno realised that the huge hills and valleys were a strong metaphor for the ups and downs of life. The struggle of trudging up a steep hill feels like the pain will never end, but when he finally reached Gnowangerup, he knew that not all hope was lost, and life does get better. It may take a while, but it does get better. "Walking is easy, living with depression is much harder", Dno says.

This "Walk for Hope" is not only to spread Hope across Australia, but this is also a healing experience for Dno and his personal mental health journey. In the past Dno has struggled with depression and knows how difficult life can be when you feel alone. The stigma around feeling this way can make it hard, particularly for men, to seek support from others. Dno's connection to the music scene of WA was the conversation starter that he needed to realise that he wasn't the only one feeling this way. Working as a video photographer for bands across WA, Dno discovered the album "Are you OK?" by the Perth band Pat Chow. The entire album resonated deeply with the emotions he was experiencing. Dno felt like the singer was speaking directly to him, but he was only sharing his own struggles with the world. Without these songs Dno would never have realised that he was depressed because the subject was never talked about and he was unable to acknowledge his feelings. Whether you are a man, woman, old, young, rich or poor we all have the same emotions and the same ability to become depressed. We are all affected by it, and the sooner we acknowledge this the closer we are to supporting those around us and putting a stop to this horrific disease. The "Walk for Hope" is Dno's way of acknowledging the lives that have been lost and trying to prevent further deaths in the future.

Throughout his journey so far, he has connected with so many people affected by suicide and has discovered that the suicide rate in rural communities is alarmingly high. Dno has designed a "Hope Flag" and he is encouraging people who have lost loved ones to suicide to write their names on the flag so that they may metaphorically walk this journey with him. To be able to do this is an incredible honour Dno says and it just emphasises how much love is in this world. Carrying the names of so many loved ones with him is a huge motivation to keep going when times get tough walking long distances.

For seven years he has wanted to do something about this tragedy, and he is finally in the right frame of mind to do so. Months of research and preparation have led him here to Gnowangerup, but this is only a small step in his travels.

The journey started on the 23rd of August, which was the anniversary of his father's passing and this first part of the "Walk for Hope" is dedicated to his father. This will be from Bunbury to the WA border. The second will be from the WA Border to the Bordertown in Adelaide and is dedicated to Dno's children who helped him on his mental health journey. The third part of the "Walk for Hope" will be revealed on his Facebook page (@dnomusicwa) when the time comes so keep an eye out for that. He is also documenting his entire journey on his Facebook page with regular updates about where he is and what he's up to.

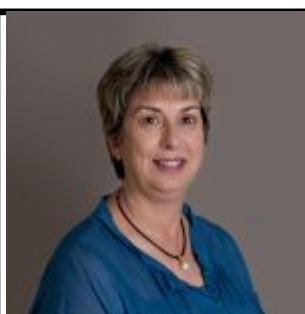

Avoid pet purchase problems

Buying a pet is not like your average purchase. The product, which might be a puppy, dog, kitten, cat, horse or rabbit is likely to become a loved member of your family and with you for its whole life.

If you have a problem with the quality or there's a defect, you're unlikely to want to use potential consumer law rights to a replacement, or return the pet for a refund. So, you need to thoroughly research the breed, its parents and the seller before you buy. Also think very carefully about your commitment to provide a suitably-sized home, food and water, exercise and look after your pet's health, including vet bills.

So far this year Consumer Protection has received 29 complaints from pet purchasers. Most (79%) were about puppies or dogs and the most common issue was misrepresentation – that might be when a dog was advertised as a medium-size breed that does not shed but grows to be very large and malts heavily.

Medical issues are common – a pre-purchase vet check can help avoid this. We also hear about a lack of documentation (be sure to get any papers and vaccination certificates) and scams where a popular breed is offered for a low price and a buyer pays in a non-secure way, such as direct bank transfer, then doesn't receive the pet.

There are too many pre-purchase tips to list, so I'd urge you to head to our website www.consumerprotection.wa.gov.au and check out our recently updated publication 'A guide to consumer rights when buying a pet'. The RSPCA also has a detailed checklist at www.rspcawa.asn.au.

You have rights under the Australian Consumer Law if you buy from a shop, or registered breeder that's a business. But these protections are unlikely to be available for private sales, via Gumtree or Facebook marketplace, or when you adopt from a shelter or rescue centre.
